INTRODUCTION

Teach Learn Grow (TLG) is a Perth-based not-for-profit that aims to address some of the barriers that rural, regional and remote students experience in Australia. In 2023, we updated our organisational vision, mission and goal statements to more accurately reflect the purpose of our work; to address the barriers preventing rural, regional and remote students from reaching their potential.

This Impact Report provides a brief overview of the tutoring and mentoring programs conducted in WA and NSW throughout 2023 and the positive impact on our stakeholders.

The Rural Program provides one-on-one tutoring to students by sending volunteers out to rural and remote communities during a week-long visit, with a specific focus on mathematics, STEAM and school engagement.



The eMentor Program provides one-on-one mentoring to students in rural and remote Australia through weekly online sessions, with a specific focus on building personal skills and emotional intelligence.






